

ORDINANCE NO. 1-88 N.S.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND, CALIFORNIA,
 AMENDING CHAPTER 3.59 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE INCREASING THE NUMBER
 OF MEMBERS ON THE ARTS COMMISSION

The Council of the City of Richmond do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 3.59.030 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"3.59.030 Appointment and qualifications of members. The Commission shall consist of fifteen (15) members who shall reflect the demographic and cultural diversity of the city and who shall not be officers or employees of the City of Richmond and who shall be appointed by the Mayor with the concurrence of the City Council. Any vacancies on the Commission shall be filled by appointment by the Mayor with the concurrence of the City Council for the unexpired portion of the term of the appointee's predecessor. A majority of the appointees shall be residents of the City of Richmond. To maintain a balance of all the arts disciplines, a majority of the members shall be professional artists, arts educators or arts administrators, and one local historian, with a commitment to public accessibility to the arts."

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect on or after its final passage and adoption.
