# Redistricting Process

---

Step	Description
<b>First Pre-Draft Hearing</b> 7/6/21	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the communities in the Districts.
<b>Second Pre-Draft Hearing</b> 9/14/21	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the communities in the Districts.
Public Workshop 8/25/21 2 p.m. & 6 p.m.	Public workshops held to review redistricting process and introduction to mapping tools.
Public Workshop 12/6/21 6 p.m.	Public workshops held to review redistricting process and introduction to mapping tools.
<b>First Draft Map Hearing</b> 1/18/2022	Public Hearings to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.
<b>Second Draft Map Hearing</b> 2/1/2022	Two Public Hearings to discuss draft maps, to discuss the election sequence, and to adopt a map
<b>Map Adoption</b> By 4/17/2022	Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption. Map adopted via ordinance.*

# Redistricting Rules and Goals

## 1. Federal Laws

Equal Population  
Federal Voting Rights Act  
No Racial Gerrymandering



## 2. California Criteria for Cities

1. **Geographically contiguous**
2. **Undivided neighborhoods and “communities of interest”**  
(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
3. **Easily identifiable boundaries**
4. **Compact**  
(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

### **Prohibited:**


“Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party.”

## 3. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles

Minimize voters shifted to different election years  
Respect voters’ choices / continuity in office  
Future population growth  
Preserving the core of existing districts


# Latino CVAP

*Latinos are particularly concentrated between San Pablo and I-580.*




# Asian-American CVAP

*Asian-Americans are concentrated around the country club and Hilltop Village in the north, in the hills of El Sobrante in the east, and along the border with El Cerrito in the south.*



# African-American CVAP

*African-Americans are particularly concentrated in Hilltop, in the 'Iron Triangle', and between Ohio Ave and I-580.*



# Defining Neighborhoods

---

**1<sup>st</sup> Question: What is your neighborhood?**

**2<sup>nd</sup> Question: What are its geographic boundaries?**

**Examples of physical features defining a neighborhood boundary:**

- Natural neighborhood dividing lines, such as highway or major roads, rivers, canals and/or hills
- Areas around parks or schools
- Other neighborhood landmarks

**In the absence of public testimony, planning records and other similar documents may provide definition.**



# Beyond Neighborhoods: Defining Communities of Interest

---

## 1<sup>st</sup> Question: What defines your community?

- Geographic Area, plus
- Shared issue or characteristic
  - Shared social or economic interest
  - Impacted by city or county policies
- Tell us “your community’s story”

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Question: Would this community benefit from being “included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation”?

- Or would it benefit more from having multiple representatives?

Definitions of Communities of Interest may not include relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.

# Beyond Neighborhoods: Communities

---

Under the California Elections Code, “community of interest” has a very specific definition in the context of districting and redistricting cities and counties:

A “community of interest” is a population that shares common social or economic interests that should be included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation.

Communities of interest do not include relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.

(emphasis added)





# Simple Map Review Tool

## Online Interactive Review Map


- ESRI's “ArcGIS Online” – similar to Google Maps in ease of use
- Used to review, analyze and compare maps, not to create them
- Includes overlays of “community of interest” and other data

## Paper “Public Participation Kit with Population Counts”


- For those without internet access or who prefer paper
- Total Population Counts only – no demographic numbers

- Adds CVAP data


