Subject:	Adopt a Resolution and Introduce an Ordinance Adjusting the Boundaries of Council Districts Based on the 2020 Decennial Census and Amending Richmond Municipal Code (RMC) Section 2.16.050
FINANCIAL IMPACT:	None
PREVIOUS COUNCIL ACTION:	March 22, 2022
STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE:	On March 22, 2022, the Richmond City Council selected District Map No. 201 adjusting the boundaries of the City Council Districts. State law requires that new district maps must be adopted by April 17, 2022, for the November 2022 election.
RECOMMENDED ACTION:	ADOPT a resolution of the City Council of the City of Richmond adjusting the boundaries of the six City Council Districts and adopting a new official Council District Map No. 201, for the City of Richmond based on the results of the 2020 decennial census and amending RMC section 2.16.050; and INTRODUCE an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Richmond adjusting the boundaries of the six City Council Districts and adopting a new official Council District Map No. 201, for the City of Richmond based on the results of the 2020 decennial census and amending RMC section 2.16.050 – City Clerk's Office (Pamela Christian 510-620-6513).

DISCUSSION:

The City of Richmond transitioned from at-large elections to by district elections in 2020. Every ten years, local governments use new census data to redraw their district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. Assembly Bill 849 (2019) and Assembly Bill 1276 (2020) require cities and counties to engage communities in the redistricting process by holding public hearings and doing public outreach. In Richmond, the City Council is responsible for drawing council districts and the redistricting process must be completed by April 17, 2022. District lines are adopted using the following state and federal criteria:

Federal Laws:

1. Equal Population (based on total population of residents as determined by the most recent federal decennial census and adjusted by the State to reassign incarcerated persons to the last known place of residence)
2. Federal Voting Rights Act
3. No Racial Gerrymandering

California Criteria for Cities (to the extent practicable and in the following order of priority):

1. Geographically contiguous districts (Areas that meet only at the points of adjoining corners are not contiguous. Areas that are separated by water and not connected by a bridge, tunnel, or regular ferry service are not contiguous)
2. Geographic integrity of local neighborhoods or communities shall be respected in a manner that minimizes its division
3. Easily identifiable boundaries that follow natural or artificial barriers (rivers, streets, highways, rail lines, etc.)
4. Lines shall be drawn to encourage geographic compactness. In addition, boundaries shall not be drawn for purposes of favoring or discriminating against a political party.

In accordance with Elections Code Section 21607 and 21607.1, the City Council held public hearings and workshops on the drawing of district boundaries. At each of the public hearings and workshops, the public was invited to provide input on the composition of the new Council district boundaries.

Redistricting outreach has included the following:

- Gabino Arredondo distributed flyers to various businesses he frequents
- Continuous announcement on the City’s electronic marquee

RESOLUTION NO.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND
ADJUSTING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE SIX CITY COUNCIL DISTRICTS AND
ADOPTING A NEW OFFICIAL COUNCIL DISTRICT MAP FOR THE CITY OF
RICHMOND BASED ON THE RESULTS OF THE 2020
DECENNIAL CENSUS**

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Findings. The City Council of the City of Richmond does find determine and declare as follows:

(a) On January 21, 2020, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 04-20 N.S. adopting section 2.16.050 (City Council Election Districts and Sequencing) pursuant to Government Code Sections 34871 to provide for the by-district election of members of the City Council, adopt the official Council District Map for the City of Richmond, establish the boundaries and identification number of each electoral district, and establish a sequencing of elections for each Council District.

(b) Pursuant to Elections Code Section 21601 and Section 2.16.050 of the Richmond Municipal Code, the City Council is required to adjust the boundaries of any or all of the Council Districts following each decennial federal census. Using the census as a basis, the City Council must adjust the boundaries so that the Council Districts are as nearly equal in population as practicable and in compliance with all applicable provisions of law, including the United States and Federal Constitutions and the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965 (52 U.S.C. Section 10301 et seq.).

(c) In accordance with Elections Code Section 21607 and 21607.1, the City Council held public hearings on the drawing of district boundaries on the dates listed below. At each of the public hearings, the public was invited to provide input on the composition of the new Council district boundaries; translation services were provided for each public hearing.

Section 2. Adoption of New Council District Map. The map attached hereto as Exhibit “A” to this resolution, and incorporated herein by this reference, is hereby approved and adopted as the Official Council District Map for the City of Richmond and shall be used in the 2022 general municipal election and all such elections for City Council thereafter, until further amended.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this resolution is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions of this resolution shall nonetheless remain in full force and effect. The City Council of the City of Richmond hereby declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this resolution, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions of this resolution be declared invalid or unenforceable.

City of Richmond 2021 Redistricting **NDC 201**



Section 3. Amendment of Section 2.16.050. Section 2.16.050 of Chapter 2.16 of the Richmond Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

“2.16.050. - City Council districts established.

Six (6) City Council districts are hereby established in the city. The boundaries and identifying number of each district shall be as described on the official "Council District Map" on file in the Office of the City Clerk as adopted by Ordinance No. 2022-___ and Resolution No. 2022-___.

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions of this ordinance shall nonetheless remain in full force and effect. The City Council of the City of Richmond hereby declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions of this ordinance be declared invalid or unenforceable.

Section 5. Certification. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and shall cause the same to be published in the manner prescribed by law. This ordinance shall be effective 30 days following the date of its adoption pursuant to Government Code Section 36937, Elections Code Section 21600, et seq, and applicable law.




