---

- ◆ This will be a fact-driven process with community input brought into the development of the plan.

# Overview of Our Approach

---

- ◆ Input from Police and Fire Department staff through interviews
- ◆ Community input through interviews and focus group meetings
- ◆ Comprehensive data collection on workloads and services
- ◆ Evaluation of service delivery and resource options. For example:
  - Redeployments of staff
  - Civilianization
  - Alternative response
- ◆ Collaboration to review findings and conclusions

# First Community Input Session

---

- ◆ This is the first of 6 community input sessions – and the community is not restricted to one session.
- ◆ Neighborhood councils have an important role connecting communities to service delivery systems, especially public safety.
