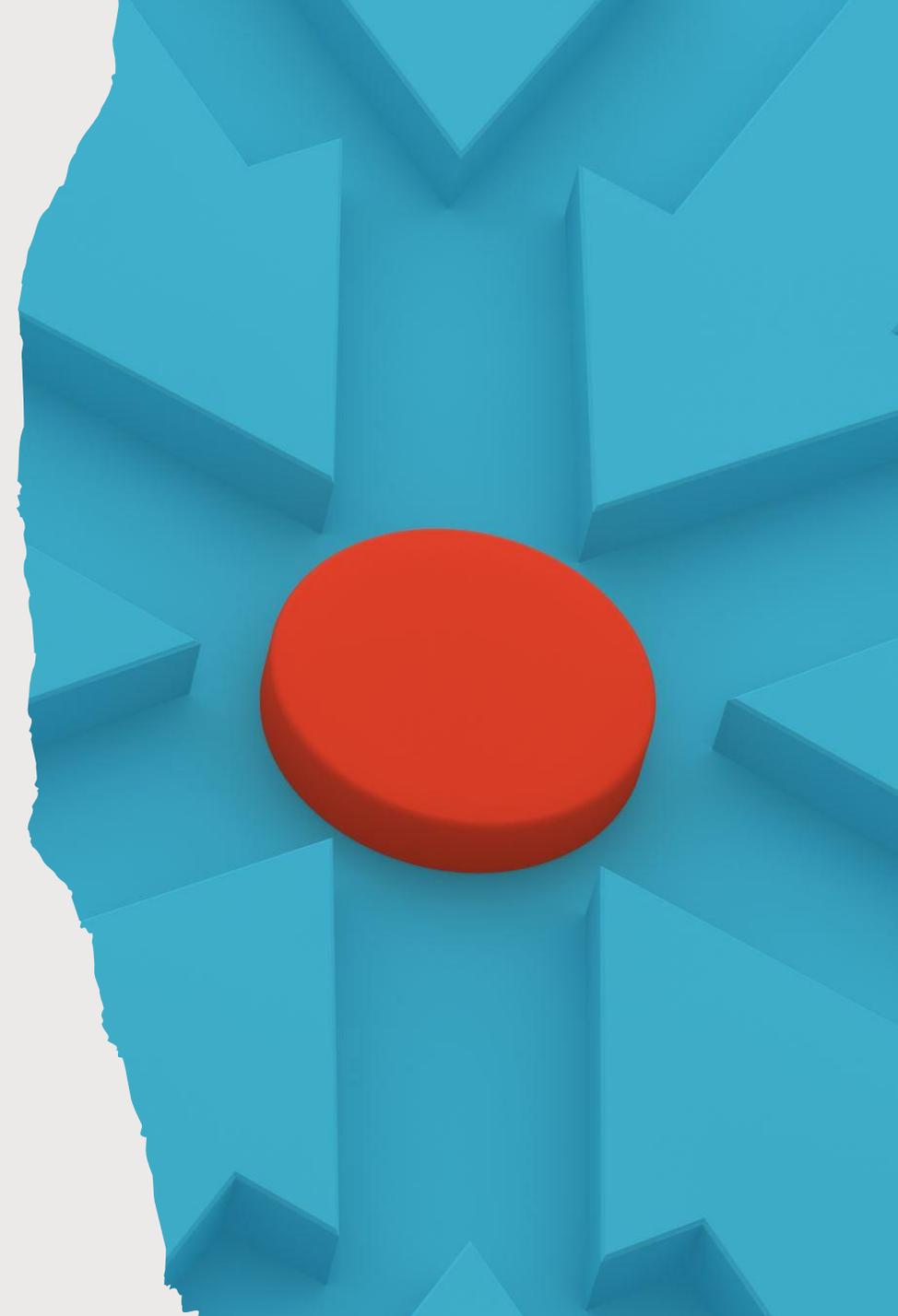

WORKERS' COMPENSATION

WHAT IS A WORK RELATED ACCIDENT, INJURY OR ILLNESS ?

- An accident, injury or illness that occurs while someone is doing something on behalf of or for the benefit of the employer.
- The accident, injury or illness is arising out of employment and occur during or in the course of employment (AOE/COE).

THE WORKER'S COMPENSATION CLAIM

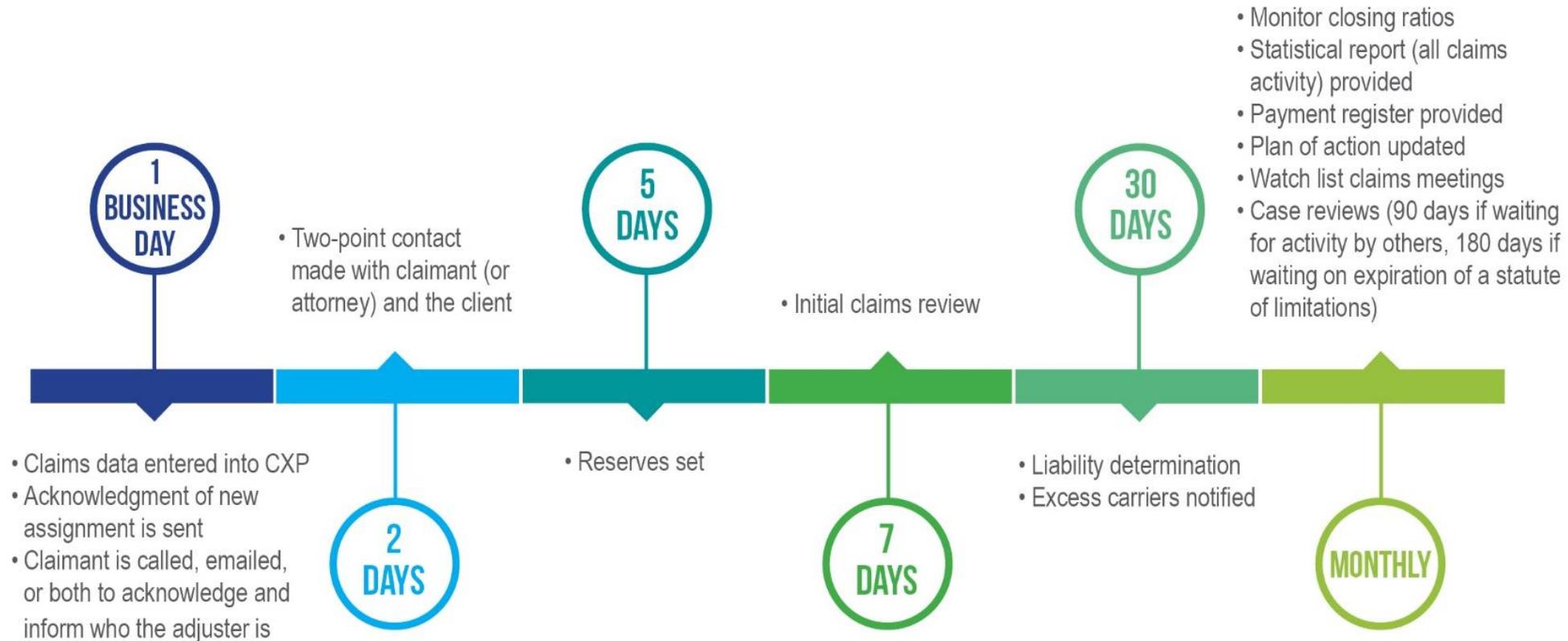
PROCESS

- Employee reports injury and wants treatment - Claim form (DWC-1) is given
- Claim is set-up – Claims examiner contacts injured worker to guide them through the process
- Claim investigated - determination to accept or deny must be made within 90 days (there are some exceptions that shorten this time frame)
- If a claim is delayed by investigation, the injured worker can still receive medical treatment up to the first \$10,000.
- Once claim is accepted, injured worker is entitled to medical treatment, lost wages and possible permanent disability award. This is all determined by the physician's reports.
- Claim settlement may include: future medical for life and a permanent disability award. Sometimes a compromise and release settlement is agreed upon to buy out all items listed and reduce the City's future liability.

GENERAL LIABILITY

- **A general liability claim is filed when a citizen believes their personal property or personal injury was due to the City or an employee of the City.**
- **Filing a claim gives the agency the opportunity to settle the claim before a lawsuit is filed and to investigate the claim so that it can properly defend itself, or to correct the conditions or practices that led to the claim.**
- **Government entities are liable only if there is a statutory basis for the liability. Government entities are also protected by a variety of immunities from lawsuits**
